### **Ten Movies Vie for Best Movie for Mature Audiences at 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Faith & Values Awards Gala Feb. 10**

Hollywood, Calif. – Fresh off its win at the Golden Globes, “The Artist” leads the pack of ten movies vying for the Best 2010 Movie for Mature Audiences, the executive producers of the 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Faith & Values Awards Gala and Report to the Entertainment Industry announced today.

The awards ceremony will be held Feb. 10 at the Universal Hilton Hotel in Universal City, Calif. in the heart of Hollywood.

The 10 nominees, in alphabetical order with major distributor, are:

- “The Artist” – The Weinstein Co.
- “Captain America: The First Avenger” – Paramount Pictures
- “Extremely Loud and Incredibly Close” – Warner Bros. Pictures
- “Mission: Impossible – Ghost Protocol” – Paramount Pictures
- “Pirates of the Caribbean: On Stranger Tides” – Walt Disney Company
- “Sarah’s Key” – The Weinstein Co.
- “Seven Days in Utopia” – Visio Entertainment
- “Thor” – Paramount Pictures
- “The Tree of Life” – Fox Searchlight
- “The Way” – Producers Distribution Agency

The 10 nominees for Best Family Movie of 2011 were announced last week.

Nominees for the two \$100,000 Epiphany Prizes for Most Inspiring Movie & TV Program of 2011 will be announced next week, as will nominees for the \$50,000 Kairos Prizes for Spiritually Uplifting Screenplays by First Time or Beginning Screenwriters, the Grace Awards for Most Inspiring Performances in Movies & TV, and the Faith & Freedom Awards for Promoting Positive American Values.

The winners will be announced Feb. 10 at the Faith & Values Awards Gala.

The Annual Faith & Values Awards Gala is sponsored by the Christian Film & Television Commission® ministry. The Commission is dedicated to “redeeming the values of the entertainment industry by influencing industry executives and by informing and equipping the public about the influence of the entertainment media.”
